

# Frequently Asked Questions

## What is your enrollment at CCCS?

As of the 2021-2022 school year, our total number of students is 69.

## What grades do you teach?

We teach students from K4 through 12<sup>th</sup> grade.

## What your denominational affiliation?

CCCS is a ministry of Cedar Creek Bible Church, and our teaching reflects our church's beliefs.
All classes are taught from a biblical worldview.

#### Are you accredited?

No, CCCS is not accredited by any outside accrediting agency.

#### What is your student-teacher ratio?

Our student-teacher ratio is approximately 11:1.

## What is your regular school schedule?

Students are in school from 8am to 3pm on weekdays. Our typical school year runs from the week of Labor Day through the end of May. Extra events such as chapel and field trips are scheduled throughout the year.

#### What curriculum do you use?

We use primarily Bob Jones University Press materials with a mixture of Abeka materials in the younger grades.

#### What are your student expectations?

Our student behavior and dress expectations are outlined in our school handbook. Parents and students are expected to read the handbook and adhere to its guidelines.

#### Do you offer AP classes?

We do not offer AP classes, but parents should keep in mind that our classes are generally more demanding than the corresponding classes offered by area public schools.

# Do you offer special ed services?

We do not typically have the staff or resources to adequately assist children with special needs. If you are unsure about your child's specific needs, we will try to have a conversation before the start of the school year to determine whether our school is a good fit for your child.

#### Do you offer a meal plan?

We do not provide meals for our students. They are expected to bring their own lunches with them.

#### How do you handle food allergies?

Parents of children with food allergies should inform their teacher at the beginning of the school year. Efforts will be made to accommodate the needs of your child.

## How do you handle tuition payments?

Parents are billed for tuition monthly. Any extra fees incurred during the year are added to this bill. Parents who wish to pay for the entire school year in a lump sum at the beginning of the year are permitted to do so.

## Is financial aid available?

We strive to keep our tuition rates down in an effort to keep Christian education affordable for our families. But we do not currently have any programs in place for financial aid.



## Do you offer extracurricular activities?

Although our own offerings are limited, we encourage students to participate in extracurricular activities. CCCS does provide music class and band class tries to accommodate students who are involved in extracurricular activities through other schools.

#### What about recess and PE?

We do not currently provide organized PE classes. Each class has its own recess schedule with multiple breaks throughout the day.

# How do you handle school closings?

For weather-related closings, we follow the decisions of Delton Kellogg Public Schools. If we need to close for any other reason, parents will be notified by phone.

#### Is bus transportation available?

We do not provide bus transportation for our students. Dropoff is 7:45-8:00am and pickup is 3:00pm.

## How do you handle student illness?

Students who are ill are expected to stay home. If a student becomes ill while at school, parents will be notified so he or she can be taken home.

#### When can I visit?

The best time to visit is during the school year when you can observe classes in progress. If you would like to schedule an appointment to see the school, please contact Pastor Norton.

## How do I apply?

Prospective families are required to read the school handbook and fill out the application forms and participate in an initial interview with Pastor Norton. The application process generally takes less than a week. CCCS reserves the right to not enroll students that are determined to not be a good fit for our program.
